2023 Year In Review

The Winona-Dakota Unity Alliance wishes to express deep gratitude to the community for supporting the organization this year. In 2022, after drawback due to the global pandemic, the Board of Directors placed the call for additional community support in fulfilling Board Member positions. Dedicated individuals stepped into new roles and carried forward the vision and mission of the organization. On May 16, 2023 the new Board of Directors hosted a meet & greet, elder visit and planning event at Unity Park. Community members, city officials, Dakota knowledge keepers, and former board members were present to discuss the history of the organization, community commitments to the “Covenant of Friendship”, and partnerships for the Winona-Dakota Gathering & Wacipi.

On Saturday, July 15, 2023 the WDUА hosted Nicky Buck (Prairie Island Dakota) in Unity Park to share cultural teachings in the park gardens. Nicky is a member of the Prairie Island Dakota Community, a Coordinator with Honoring Dakota Project, and a Red Wing School Board Member, among other community roles. Several years ago, the WDUА received sweetgrass (waçangа) and sage (pežihota bdaska) from Prairie Island Dakota Community gardens. The WDUА worked with Parks and Recreation in the City of Winona to steward these plants. Together they aim to highlight the cultural significance of the plants by hosting community education events and developing artistic and interpretive signs to increase visibility and public understanding. Thank you to Nicky Buck for sharing cultural teachings in Unity Park.

On September 20, 2023 community members joined together at Unity Park to create community artwork and tend the garden. The artwork featured sweetgrass/waçangа and prairie sage/ pežihota bdaska. The artwork was created in gratitude to Prairie Island Dakota Community, honoring the gift of sweetgrass and sage shared with the Winona community. A special thanks to Sarah Johnson, The Joy Labs for helping with artwork and Sara Holger, Driftless Naturalist LLC for leading the gardening efforts.

The Winona-Dakota Gathering, Homecoming & Wacipi event was held September 29 through October 1, 2023 at Unity Park. The theme of the 2023 gathering was “Twenty Years Building Friendship/ Waniyetu wikcemna numpa Kadakiciyapi kagapi”. The theme honored the history of the WDUА, which shaped the “Covenant of Friendship”. Carrying on its unique tradition, the Gathering continued to be a space, not of competition, but an invitation for participation and cultural exchange. Events that were held include Sunrise Ceremony, Veteran Honor Guard flag raising, Community Talk Circle, Grand Entry, Unity Feast, and more. Thank you to Arnold Williams, Butch Felix, Gordon Weston Veteran’s Lodge, Hoka Hey Host Drum for your leadership and sharing.

The Gathering also devoted time to Remember Our Loved Ones, a memorial of those who have been lost to opioids or alcohol. People of all race, culture and class are affected by this epidemic. Names and photos of loved ones were displayed on memorial posters around the ceremonial circle during a time to share stories and connect with one another. The memorial included an opening prayer, stories shared by family members and loved ones, addresses by Scott Sherman, Mayor of Winona; Senator Jeremy Miller, District 26; and Jeremy Drucker, Director of Addiction & Recovery, Office of Governor Waltz. The Remember Our Loved Ones memorial was organized in partnership with Malia Fox of Winona and Suzanne Nash, Indigenous Peoples Task Force.

The WDUА kindly thanks all who offer their time, knowledge, talents, donations, efforts, and thoughts of goodwill as we work towards our mission.

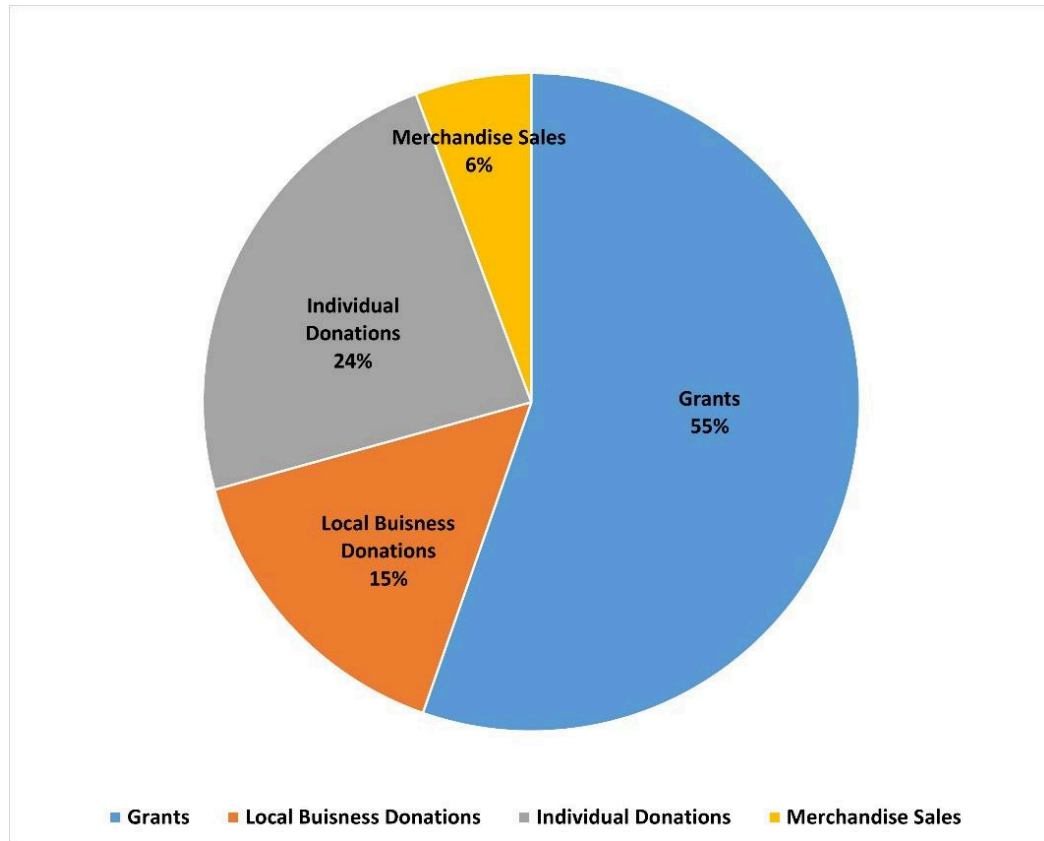

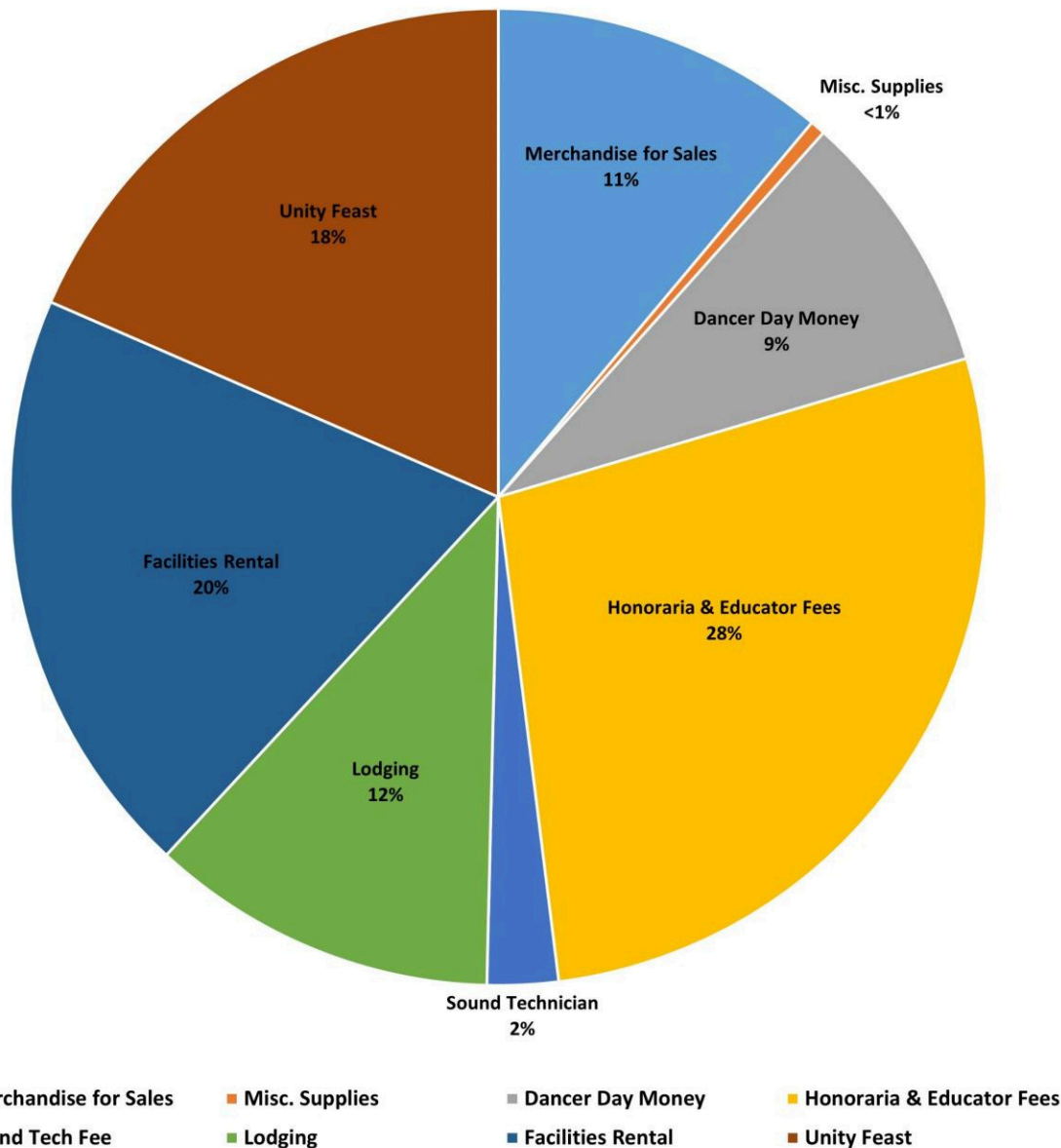
